Principal Cello Augsburg Philharmonic/ State Theater Augsburg

Julien Chappot has been the principal solo cellist of the Augsburg Philharmonic Orchestra since April 2004. Born in Besançon in 1979, he studied in France with Jean-Luc Loewenguth and Michel Strauss. He continued his education in Mainz, Augsburg, and Munich with Julius Berger, Patrick Demenga, and Michael Hell. From 2001 to 2003, he was a member of the Orchestra Academy of the Munich Philharmonic and took part in productions with conductors such as James Levine, Christian Thielemann, Zubin Mehta, and Günter Wand.

Julien Chappot attended masterclasses with Maud Tortelier, Siegfried Palm, Philippe Muller, Gary Hoffman, Eberhard Feltz, and the Orpheus Quartet. He has collaborated with numerous composers, including Wilhelm Killmayer and Krzysztof Penderecki.

Julien Chappot is a member of the Seraphin Piano Trio and a regular guest soloist with the Bavarian Chamber Philharmonic. Since 2006, Julien Chappot has been teaching at the Leopold Mozart College of Music at the University of Augsburg.
