

The Rising of the Moon

The composition "The Rising of the Moon", named after the Irish ballad of the same name, portrays the horrors of armed conflict and the consequences of blind war enthusiasm. The song, which originated toward the end of the 19th century, recounts a battle during the Irish Rebellion of 1798. According to the Iyrics, the warriors are to gather with their pikes and march against the British. As the song progresses, they merge into a black mass, marching along the river in the moonlight with gleaming weapons and green banners. z At the end freedom is celebrated – but the atrocities of such conflicts are left unmentioned. That's why I aim to depict these horrors to show where such confrontations lead to in the end. The composition is divided into five parts:

I. Introduction:

A beautiful, clear night; moonlighted meadows; it is very quiet; only the piano hints at a nearby military camp by paraphrasing soldiers marching.

II. The Singing Soldiers:

The song appears in its original form, with contrasting marching figures on the C string and harmonics on the G string representing the singing. After some time, the song gradually breaks apart and becomes increasingly distorted.

After a virtuoso variation the soldiers finally realize the grim fate awaiting them.

III. The Horrors of War:

The battle begins and scenes of fighting are depicted.

IV. After the Battle:

An almost threatening silence reigns after the battle. In contrast to the composition's beginning, this silence is not beautiful, but horrifying and filled with the aftermath of the conflict.

V. Corpses in the Moonlight:

An echo of the song is heard once more – now detuned by a quarter tone. The moonlight, initially perceived as beautiful, now shines upon the corpses of the soldiers.

Leonhard Gaigg - award winning composer of "The rising of the moon"

Leonhard Gaigg was born on 31 January 2005. He lives in Ebensee am Traunsee (Upper Austria). He was admitted to the Pre-College Division ("Akademie für Begabtenförderung") of the Anton Bruckner Private University in Linz at the age of 14, where he has received instruction since then. In 2023, Leonhard Gaigg founded the ensemble Synergia together with saxophonist and composer Clara Donat. The two musicians regularly compose new works for this ensemble, which they premiere together. As a composer, he puts particular emphasis on combining acoustic instruments with electroacoustics. At present, he is studying clarinet with Gerald Kraxberger and composition with Volkmar Klien. {...} His work "The Rising of the Moon" for cello and piano was awarded 1st prize in the Lions Music Composition Competition in 2025.
